- David Marceau, resident, discussed the 27 acre parcel on New England Road, as being wet lands, and with no lines marked or pins for the property line. David will borrow a GPS unit to flag the property.
- Discussion on Gartley and Dorsky has a list of sand shed's they have worked on in the past.
- Discussion on prefabbed sheds for the resident's winter sand pile. A quote has not been received from the Amish builder.
- Selectman Milinazzo discussed the Broadband Committee signed the Broadband Corporation papers. The RFP is being reviewed, the Committee is meeting with Mission Broadband.
